THE BELTLINE

A 22-mile transit system, 33-mile trail network, encompassing 8% of the City of Atlanta's total land. It promises 28,000 new and 5,600 affordable housing units, 30,000 permanent and 48,000 construction jobs, and is estimated to generate up to \$20 billion in total projected economic development.

DID YOU KNOW?

Communities are rapidly changing as development reaches in to neighborhoods that are historically black, driving up property taxes and rents for many low-income residents

This process is rapidly gentrifying historic communities and potentially displacing residents

The Beltline has only built 985 of the 5,600 affordable units promised under the project, and they have announced that their goal will be impossible to reach without changes to the policies and sources of funding that control Atlanta's affordable housing landscape
